Semester 4 of the Masters provides you with the opportunity to undertake a six month Professional Practice and Research in industry. This capstone subject will enable you to integrate theory with the practice of work to develop your knowledge, skills and professional networks through lived experiences in a natural workplace setting. There is an expectation that you have a minimum of 200 hours industry experience prior to undertaking their Professional Practice and Research in industry.

You can engage the ICHM Industry and Career Development (ICD) Managers to assist them with sourcing an industry position for the purpose of this subject. The ICD Managers employ a similar process to that which is used for the standard industry placements; with most positions within Australia being paid as regular employees. ICHM works with a number of valued industry partners to facilitate the work integrated learning periods.

THE ICHM AWARD

POSTGRADUATE COURSES

FIRST YEAR

- Applicants who meet the ICHM's academic and English language entry requirements for their chosen course will be award 10% of the tuition fee.
- Applicants who meet the ICHM's academic entry requirements and achieved IELTS 7.0 or equivalent for their chosen course will be award 15% of the tuition fee.

FOR EACH SUBSEQUENT YEARS OF STUDY:

- If students get a credit or higher in every subject in their first year: 15% on the following year of study.
- If a student fails a subject, no scholarship applies on the retake subject.
- If a student fails to the point that they breach course progression, they will be exited (therefore no further scholarship applies).

SELECTION CRITERIA

No application is required. All eligible applicants will receive a scholarship until the scholarship quota is filled.

DURATION

The duration of the Scholarship is the minimum time in which the course can be completed.

PRE-MASTERS OF INTERNATIONAL HOTEL MANAGEMENT

Pre-Masters Program (non-award) is offered as an alternative pathway into the ICHM Master of International Hotel Management. This six month full time pathway program is designed to be an academic, literacy and numeracy bridging program for international students who do not meet the standard Masters entry requirements. To progress to the Master of International Hotel Management, students must pass each subject in the Pre-Masters.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of a three year post-secondary qualification comparable to an Australian Associate Degree or Advanced Diploma; and English IELTS 6.0 overall (no band under 5.5). For more information, go to https://www.ichm.edu.au/future-students/international-students/entry-requirements

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN INTERNATIONAL HOTEL MANAGEMENT

The Graduate Certificate in International Hotel Management is a six month full time course designed to provide opportunities for participants to develop specialised knowledge, skills and understanding to undertake lower level management positions in international hotels. The Graduate Certificate course is nested within our Master of International Hotel Management course. It qualifies as an entry pathway into the Mastes's degree.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum of a Bachelor Degree (AQF Level 7 or international equivalent) in any discipline; or Minimum of five years' industry experience in a middle management position, or Advanced Diploma in any discipline (AQF Level 6 or international equivalent) with a minimum of three years' industry experience. English fluency at IELTS 6.0 Academic overall with no band below 5.5 or an equivalent score in other acceptable tests.
