## Victoria University of Wellington Degree Progression Requirement

To gain entry to a Victoria University of Wellington undergraduate degree from the foundation studies programme:

- Successfully complete 120 credits in the Foundation Studies Programme
- Achieve a minimum of 50% in all four core subjects
- Achieve 50% or higher in six optional subjects equal to 60 credits (300 marks out of a possible 600)

<b>Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)</b>	February	4	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II	Entry into second year is competitive and based on first year results
<b>Bachelor of Global Studies</b>	February, July	3	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II	
<b>Bachelor of Health</b>	February, July	3	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II	
<b>Bachelor of Laws</b>	February	4	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II	Entry into second year is competitive and based on first year results; entry to parallel third- and fourth-year Honours programme is by invitation after high achievement in second year
<b>Bachelor of Music</b>	February, July	3	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II	Complete 'Application to Audition' form; audition required for Classical Performance and Jazz
<b>Bachelor of Science</b>	February, July	3	50% in English for Tertiary Study Parts I and II
