Bachelor of Global Studies (BGS)

Duration: 3 years

The Bachelor of Global Studies is a qualification that takes you across disciplines and allows you to focus on different aspects of the issues at the heart of our globally connected world—while developing your knowledge of te ao Māori and Aotearoa's place in the global context.

Studying in Wellington, you will connect with change-makers and be ready to launch an exciting career, locally or internationally.

Career opportunities



Graduates of the Bachelor of Global Studies will be equipped to take up leadership roles and make valuable contributions locally and globally across a range of fields, including: foreign affairs and diplomacy, government, non-governmental organisations, policy and research, public and private international organisations, teaching, and tourism.

Employability

A Bachelor of Global Studies degree will prepare you for your local or global career in a range of industries and institutions. Graduates may increase their chances of getting a job by gaining experience through internships or voluntary work.

Foreign policy officers represent New Zealand's interests overseas and provide policy advice to the Government on foreign affairs and trade issues.

» Entry-level foreign policy officers usually earn

\$63K - \$69K a year

» Mid-level foreign policy officers can earn between

\$69K - \$110K a year

» Senior foreign policy officers can earn from

\$110K - \$150K a year

Policy analysts gather and analyse information to assist in the planning, development, interpretation and review of government or industrial policies

» Policy analysts usually earn between

\$68K - \$85K a year

Senior policy analysts usually earn between

\$102K - \$116K a year

» Principal advisors usually earn between

\$132K - \$155K a year

Intelligence officers collect and analyse information on people, places and events that may be a threat to businesses or national and international security.

» Intelligence officers in training usually earn between

\$46K - \$51K a year

» Mid-level intelligence officers usually earn between

\$60K - \$86K a year

» Senior intelligence officers can earn between

\$72K - \$135K a year

PROGRESSION REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry to a Victoria University of Wellington undergraduate degree from the Foundation Studies Programme:

- Successfully complete 120 credits in the Foundation Studies Programme.
- Achieve 50% or higher in all English courses and two other core subjects, equal to 60 credits.
- Achieve 50% or higher in six optional subjects equal to 60 credits (300 marks out of a possible 600).

SCHOLARSHIPS

Progression Scholarships

Progression scholarships of up to NZ\$5,000 are awarded towards the tuition fees of the first year of undergraduate degree study at Victoria University of Wellington.

Pathway Scholarships

International Excellence Scholarships of up to NZ\$5,000 and Fast Track Foundation Scholarships of up to NZ\$2,500 are available for the Foundation Studies Programme.

Foundation Connect Scholarship

Student who successfully progress from Foundation Connect programme to Standard Foundation programme will be awarded up to NZ\$5,000 scholarship if they achieve top results.
