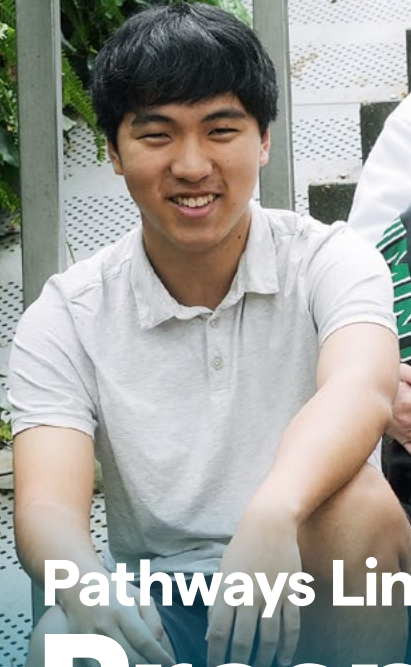

## Our campus

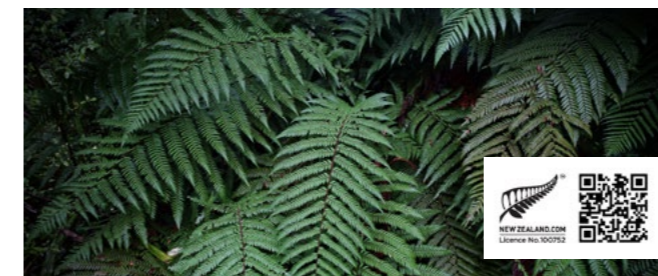
The UP International College New Zealand is located in the heart of Auckland's CBD, close to public transport, accommodation and a vibrant range of entertainment and cultural offerings.

This accelerated one-year programme will offer successful students entry into the University of Auckland, AUT, Victoria University of Wellington Foundation Studies programmes.

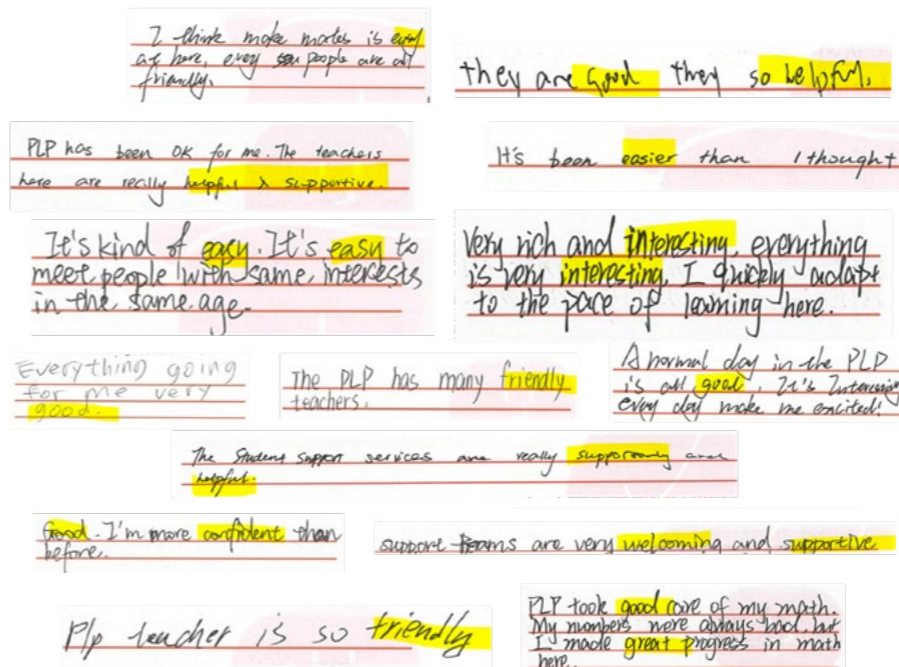
It is an innovative educational initiative designed specifically for international students aged 14 - 17 who have recently finished their junior high school education and aspire to study abroad. This unique programme provides a direct pathway for students to access one of the leading universities in New Zealand.

Pathways Link Programme offers a specialised curriculum combining rigorous academics with an immersive English-language learning environment, ensuring students are well-prepared for future academic endeavours.

# Course Structure

The Pathways Link Programme caters specifically to the unique needs of younger international students, providing them with a supportive and nurturing environment to excel academically and culturally.

Students will receive a broad and varied curriculum, to help them learn English, prepare for Foundation Studies, and find their preferences for degree study.

Example subjects studied are:

- **PLP1A:** English, Maths, Biology, Economics, Global Studies
- **PLP1B:** English, Maths, Physics, Business, Media Studies

There will be regular opportunities for individual and team games and sports, using different locations across Auckland. Students should bring physical education clothing and shoes.

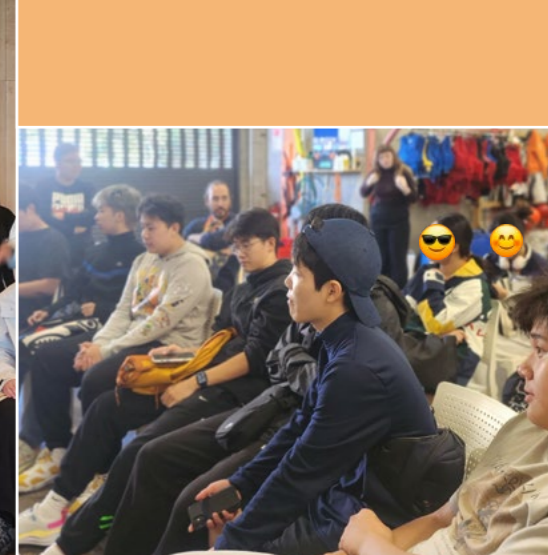


# Education Outside the Classroom

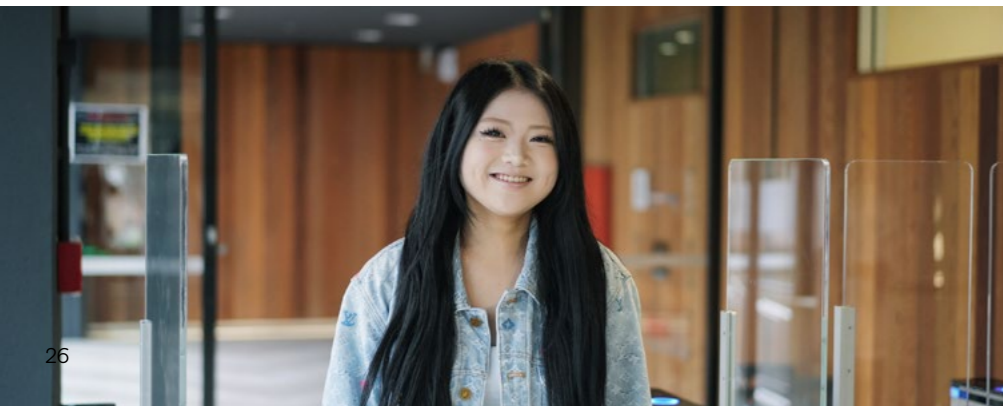

## Visa checking and monitoring

The Administrative Services Team is responsible for checking and monitoring the visa status of our students. They will send reminders to students whose visas are about to expire, communicate with Immigration New Zealand when there are errors on the visas.

## Accommodation

International students who are under 18 may choose to live with their parent(s) or a designated caregiver. To get the most out of experiencing life in New Zealand, you are encouraged to live with a local homestay family.

## Medical and travel insurance

The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021 requires all international students studying in

New Zealand to have appropriate health and travel insurance during their period of study.

Allianz Partners is our preferred insurance provider. Enrolled international students will be charged Allianz's Studentsafe Inbound University insurance premium when enrolment is completed. You must pay this fee unless the University approves the use of an alternative insurance provider.

You must have approved insurance for the duration of your study and covering the duration of their visa or until they depart New Zealand, whichever comes first.

*Note: Your UP International College New Zealand student ID number is also your insurance policy number. You are not automatically covered for pre-existing medical conditions. However, cover can be arranged in certain circumstances on application to Allianz before your programme starts.*





# Homestay

For students who are under 18, it is mandatory that you reserve your accommodation through the International College. This option is available to students over 18 as well.

Homestay accommodation includes a room for you with a bed, desk, adequate heating and internet access. All meals are included for full-board Homestay option.

- A 24/7 number is provided in case of emergency.
- All students under 18 are visited in their accommodation by our accommodation agency quarterly until students turn 18.
- UP Education will arrange payment to be made to the homestay provider.
- All accommodation is thoroughly checked – each homestay family is interviewed and the home inspected before a student is placed.
- All homestay providers sign a contract agreeing to specific rules and standards and undergo a vetting procedure by New Zealand Police.

# Entry Requirements

## Age requirement:

Must be between 14 and 17 years old.

## English language:

Must have an IELTS (Academic) score of 4.5 with no band lower than 4.0, or an equivalent score, including the UP English Language Test (UPELT).

## Academic:

- **New Zealand:** Completion of Year 10 with a good school report, including satisfactory attendance (90%) and teacher comments. This assessment will be conducted by the Head of College.
- **China:** Completion of Middle School with Year 3 at 70%, or an average of 70% across all three years.
- **South Korea:** Completion of Middle School or attainment of 70% in the Middle School GEE.

For entry requirements from other countries, please scan the QR code on the right-hand side.

# Progression Requirements

Students must meet the minimum English language and academic requirements to successfully progress to the Foundation Studies programme.

- English 60%
- Minimum score in all academic subjects 50%
- Pass all Learning Outcomes

Students who successfully complete the programme but do not meet the required grades to progress to Foundation Studies will have the opportunity to enroll in Foundation Connect.

# Scholarships

## Pathways Link scholarship

The scholarship is available for the students who apply and are accepted into the Pathways Link Programme in 2025.

## Pathways Link Progression scholarship

Students who successfully progress from the Pathways Link Programme to the Standard Foundation Programme will be eligible for scholarships. The scholarships will be awarded based on the student's final academic performance.

\*Note that when students progress onto the Certificate in Foundation Studies, they will not need to pay this again.





# UP English Language Test (UPELT)

The UP English Language Test (UPELT) has been developed to provide prospective students with an opportunity to quickly obtain an English language score prior to enrolment into a programme of their choice.

The test is facilitated online by highly qualified and experienced staff. It consists of computer-based, hand-written, and examiner-led tasks. Test description and instructions for test preparation are made available to all prospective candidates in advance, and a practice test is provided. Measures are taken to ensure the integrity of the test.

The UPELT is facilitated every Wednesday afternoon (1pm NZ Standard Time). Bookings can be arranged through the UP Admissions Team, [admissions@up.education](mailto:admissions@up.education).



## One day before the test, candidates will be sent:

- information about the UPELT and technical requirements
- the test security procedure
- instructions on how to set up the room and desk for the test
- demonstration of how to use two devices with cameras during the test
- login instructions
- a practice test
- a Microsoft Teams link for joining the test

## 1. Application

Create a secure account and complete the application form with the guidance of a step-by-step process. Ensure that you have the following documents ready to be uploaded:

- **Certified copy of your passport\***
- **Copy of your most recent school reports or other qualifications**
- **Evidence of achieving the minimum English proficiency requirement**

\*Your identity document will have to be certified or verified by an approved person before you can submit it online. ## 2. Accept the offer

**Once your application has been received and assessed, you will:**

- Receive an offer letter for the Foundation programme.
- Be able to review and update the required documents up until accepting the offer.

**Once conditions of entry have been met, you will receive:**

- An unconditional offer letter for the Foundation programme
- A conditional offer for your degree
- Details on how to create your student account with the University



## 3. Payment

- Sign into **Student Services Online**. Click on the **Fees and Payments** icon to open the **Account Summary** page.
- Click **Pay by Flywire-International** tab and enter the total amount, on the Fees Estimate of your offer letter, in the Payment Amount (NZ Dollars) field, you may need to **Unblock your Pop-ups** in order to **Transfer to pay by Flywire** so that Flywire site can open in a new window.
- Click the **Transfer to pay by Flywire** icon and follow the on-screen instructions to complete your payment. You can visit Flywire fees payment method for international students for more information. At the same time as you receive your unconditional (firm) offer from the University, you will also receive an invoice and payment instructions for the UP Education application fee.
- You should also pay the relevant application fee to UP Education directly through Flywire. Please go to [upic.flywire.com](https://upic.flywire.com). If you need help with your payment, go to [flywire.com/support](https://flywire.com/support). The fees to pay UP Education directly will be: Application Fee/IELTS Test fee (if applicable)/ Airport Pick Up Fee (if applicable)/ Accommodation fees (if applicable).
