Background

Hi everyone, my name is Iris. I came to New Zealand when I was 16 and finished both high school and university here. I studied statistics at the University of Auckland, but after graduation I decided I wanted to do something more meaningful—so I chose to become an early childhood teacher.

Why I Chose NZTC

When I searched for ECE programmes, NZTC stood out because of the balance between theory and practice. I believe being a good teacher comes from experience, not just academic learning. *NZTC offers plenty of practicum hours and hands-on opportunities, which is what I was looking for.*

Study Experience

The Graduate Diploma takes one year and three months to complete. *We had nine courses and four practicums.* It was quite intense—we needed to do essays, full-day practicum, and 16 weekly centre hours. It was a lot of pressure, but very rewarding in the end.

Practicum and Home Centre

I had two home centres during my study—Little People and Takapuna Kids. Both were great in their own ways. I changed because my AT was away on holiday. Each centre had different philosophies and teaching styles, and I learnt a lot from experiencing both.

Challenges and Support

Academic writing was hard for me. I even failed two courses at first. But the lecturers, my assistant teachers, and visiting teachers always told me, "You're a good teacher." That support meant a lot. NZTC also gave us helpful guidance —like how to find home centres and prepare for interviews.

Creating Teaching Resources

One thing I really enjoy is making teaching resources. I love origami, so I created a "forest box" using a tissue box and animal figures. The children loved it! They'd sing songs and pick animals from the box. It made learning fun and meaningful.

From Student to Staff

Being a student teacher and being staff are very different. As a student, you just follow the routine and play with children. But as a staff member, you need to cooperate with colleagues, talk to parents, and make sure everything runs smoothly. It's a big step, but it's worth it.

The Importance of Practicum

When I first started practicum, I was so nervous my brain went totally blank! But after one year of practice, I felt confident and natural working with children. Practicum helped me grow a lot more than any textbook ever could.





Finding a Home Centre

Finding a home centre wasn't easy. I lived in an area with few ECE centres and many student teachers. But I followed NZTC's guidance, wrote a good survey, and eventually found a place. It taught me persistence and self-management.

Career and Visa Plans

I'm still on a student visa, but after graduation I'll apply for a post-study work visa. I've already started applying for jobs. Once I get a job, I plan to apply for residency and bring my family to New Zealand in the future. That's a big goal for me.

My Dream

My dream is simple—to be a good teacher. I want to support children to become better people, to grow with confidence and kindness. For now, I just want to enjoy working with little kids every day. They always make me happy, even when things go wrong.

Final Advice

Find a good home centre, and look after yourself. Working with children is beautiful, but also very physical. Staying healthy is important. This job is like a dream: even when it's hard, the children's smiles make everything better.
